The Friends of the Hurtwood - history and role of the Trust

- 2,000 acres of open access countryside within the Surrey Hills
- Created via Deed in 1926 objectives to:
 - 1. Manage and preserve public access
 - 2. Protect the environment
 - 3. Educate the public about the environment and its conservation
- Funded by donations from c.500
 Friends & management fees from Landowners and some LA grants





The Friends of the Hurtwood - history and role of the Trust

• Issues:

- Impact of increased use, particularly through Covid Lockdowns
- Conflict between different users and residents' views, management of Events
- Raising funds to cope with rising costs
- Challenge of capturing a fair contribution from all users
- Continuing to find volunteers

Summary



- Large area of Surrey Hills with open access managed by small charitable trust
