1. Introduction:

1.1 Although the fundamental purpose of the Management Plan will be to encourage co-ordinated action by all organisations, agencies and individuals, the Surrey Hills AONB Board has established a Surrey Hills group of organisations (the Surrey Hills Family) to help support the delivery of the AONB Management Plan's Vision:

The Surrey Hills is recognised as a national asset in which its natural and cultural assets are managed in an attractive landscape mosaic of farmland, woodland, heaths, downs, and commons. It provides opportunities for sustainable business enterprise and for all to enjoy and appreciate its natural beauty for their health and well-being.

1.2 This work plan highlights priorities for 2024 – 25 which deliver the adopted Surrey Hills AONB Management Plan (2020 – 2025) pillars:

Planning

Landscape Conservation and Enhancement; Access,

Enjoyment and Understanding

Growing the Surrey Hills Economy and

Advocacy, Partnership and Coordination.

Pillar 2. LANDSCAPE CONSERVATION AND ENHANCEMENT			
 Environmental Land Management Schemes to ensure more, bigger and less fragmented areas for wildlife, Defra has announced a new £5m FiPL Historic Building Restoration Grant for 24/25. This is in addition to the individual allocations for each PL. This is a national fund held by Defra to which PLs can bid for specific projects which meet the criteria FiPL has agreed to fund a contribution to the Surrey Hills Society Projects & Volunteer Coordinator post.
